CC EXAMINATION – Level I (Provisional) Time: 2.5 hours Exam & Scoresheet. Pass Mark = 75%.

Knowledge of the Laws of Cricket which relate to scoring is required. There will be questions on Laws related to scoring and on scoring practice: There are 20 multi-part MCC questions. The mark for each sub-question is 1. – Most questions may be answered using one word. MCC Law numbers are NOT needed. The ICC Component has 7 questions.

CC SCORESHEET REQUIREMENT: (1) Local Quiz Scoresheet. (2) Exam Scoresheet – part of CC Exam

Completion of a scoring record from a ball by ball story of an innings (approx.12 overs): Batsman's record with correct symbols for extras, fall of wickets, all balls bowled to the batsman must be recorded and balancing of balls bowled/balls received are required. Bowling analysis and bowler summaries, Cumulative tally & Overs summary are required. All match information given must be entered.

- Detailed knowledge of how to <u>maintain</u>. complete and balance a full score-sheet including the match summary section.
- Knowledge of how many runs count for various actions.
- Knowledge of what counts as one of the 6 balls in the over.
- Knowledge of how to balance the runs in the batting section of the scoring record with the runs in the bowling section.
- Knowledge of the following equations;
- All batsmen's runs + all extras = Cumulative Tally (Total Runs).
- All batsmen's runs + all bowling extras = All bowlers' totals.
- All bowlers' totals + all fielding extras = Cumulative Tally.
- Balls Received + wide deliveries = Balls Bowled.
- The scoring record must be finished and shown to be balanced.
